

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I wish all of you a happy and blessed new year with God's guidance and peace! – A new calendar year has begun. Year in and year out time is running. Our lifetime is running, nonstop. And while it seems that everything changes rapidly, the dark clouds above us often don't seem to change. Then it is important to have one thing in life that never changes; a point of rest and a moment of security. We Christians are lucky to have such a solid ground in God's Word. God's Word remains in eternity and it provides orientation and footing. – This is also something the Moravians knew. They were a group of pious church reformists approx. 100 years before the Reformation, following their leader Jan Hus. They came originally from Bohemia and Moravia (today the main parts of the Czech Republic). Because of their faith they had to leave their countries several times until the 20th century. Today they are a protestant denomination, close to the Lutherans. 288 years ago they settled in the region of Saxony (Germany). There they started to draw lots out of a collection of 1824 verses from the Old Testament as a message for every day. Then they choose another word from the New Testament, which fitted to the lot. For 288 years they have done this without interruption until today. Since 1731 they have printed little books so that everyone can read a message for the day, translated into 60 different languages for more than 100 countries. If you'd like to have a short word/thought from God's Word and/or not enough time for a longer daily devotion I recommend the "Moravian Daily Texts" to you. – This tradition encouraged the "Oecumenical Working Group for Reading the Bible" in Germany to select a special word from the Bible as a motto or watchword for every year. For 2018 they chose Revelation 21, 6b: Jesus Christ says: "To the thirsty I will give water without cost from the spring of the water of life." – I wish and pray that this living water from the spring of life, God's Word, Sacrament, forgiveness and peace, will accompany you all the days in this year that it will become a year full of mercy of the Lord for you.

The Evangelical Lutheran Church of England (1.000 Baptized members in 14 Congregations)
 Chairman Reverend Jon Ehlers: "May God's peace and joy be yours this Christmas as we sing joy to the world, Lord is come. From your Brothers and Sisters in Christ."

Portuguese Evangelical Lutheran Church (95 Baptized members in 3 Congregations) President Reverend Adalberto Hiller: "Queridos irmãos. É o anjo lhes disse: Eis aqui vos trago novas de grande alegria, que o será para todo o povo. Hoje na cidade de David vos nasceu o Salvador." Lutheran Church-Canada (62.649 Baptized members in 304 Congregations) President: Reverend Dr Robert Bugbee: "With these lines I send you sincere greetings from Winnipeg, the coldest English-speaking major city on the face of the earth. Fortunately, the Lord is giving us some December days that are milder than usual, a little bit more like civilized western Europe! These lines come not from me alone, but from our approximately 300 congregations in Lutheran Church-Canada (LCC), as well as from our pastors and deacons. We are not a large group, but we are spread over a vast area: It is 6327 kilometres from St. Andrew's Lutheran Church in Halifax, Nova Scotia (on the Atlantic) to Grace Lutheran Church, Port Alberni, Vancouver island, British Columbia (close to the Pacific). The rest of our Canadian Lutheran family is somewhere in between. May God pour out His Spirit on your pastors and on all those who will have a part in hosting and leading the services of Christmas. In the person of Jesus, the true God came down and took His place next to us in this dark world so that we one day could take our place beside Him on high and sing His praises forever. May God give you the heart and the words to hold out this Christ to people who come to worship with you this Christmas. Sincere greetings and love in Christ our Lord."

Independent Evangelical—Lutheran Church (Germany) (34,542 Baptized members in 187 Congregations) Bishop Hans-Jörg Voigt: "At the Feast of the Nativity of our Saviour Christ Jesus and for the New Year 2018 we wish you contemplation, quietude and blessing."

Evangelical Lutheran Church in Belgium (150 Baptized members in 2 Congregations) President: Gijbertus van Hattem: "To all the Lutherans in the world we wish a blessed Christmas and 'Anno Domini' 2018."

Lutheran Church Synod of Nicaragua (1.800 Baptized members in 23 Congregations) President: Reverend Marvin Donaire: "Hola hermanos en el Señor Jesus el cristo feliz navidad que Dios los bendiga."

Free Evangelical Lutheran Synod in South Africa (2.827 Baptized members in 17 Congregations) Bishop Dr Dieter Reinstorff: "I am writing to you from South Africa, where we will be celebrating Christmas in the middle of Summer. But irrespective of where God has placed us in the world, his word remains unchanged and his mercy reaches out to all of us. [...] God came in a quiet, inconspicuous way born as a child and laid in a manger. The heavens opened, but there was no earthquake, no lightning that made the mountains tremble. Instead on the field of Bethlehem and angelic choir sang a song: "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to men on whom his favour rests" (Lk 2:14). That is the Christmas message: God has come to us, but he has come to bring peace and forgiveness. He comes in humility and weakness, reaching out to our heart. I pray that we will all share in God's peace and love to others."

Lutheran Church of Australia (49.600 Baptized members in more than 466 Congregations) Bishop John Henderson: "May the miracle of the first Christmas fill your hearts with joy. The Lord be with you as we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ, our Saviour."
