 500 years of singing— Reformation in Brussels Dear Members and Friends of our ALCB,

Just a few weeks ago it looked very different in our services. We were lucky if there were ten or twelve of us who sang together, prayed, listened to God's word and gathered around the altar. The pandemic and our typical changes had left their mark. In the church board we were at a loss what to do. - And once again we were proved wrong. We may be only a small Lutheran congregation and church here in Belgium. But in fact a ma-



jor event of the Reformation took place here in Brussels. And this anniversary is now returning for the 500th time. Saturday 1 July 2023 marks the 500th anniversary of the burning of the first martyrs of the Reformation worldwide. On 1 July 1523, two Antwerp Augustinian monks, Jan van Esschen and Hendrik Voes, were burned at the Grand Place in Brussels for refusing to revoke their Lutheran views. This was the first time ever that followers of the Reformation were executed for this. (In Munich/Germany, only 6 days later, the first Lutheran, baker's servant Sebastian Tuschler, was executed for his Lutheran beliefs). Shocked by their fate and in response to the burning in Brussels, Martin Luther composed his first hymn, a tenstanza ballad ("A New Song We Raise") telling the story of the two Augustinian brothers. At the same time, this was the beginning of a broad development of poetry of hymns, first of the

Protestant, but later also of the Roman Catholic Church. Today, the diverse congregational singing is a natural part of worship life on both sides, Protestant and Roman Catholic, and has also influenced church life in other parts of the world. Starting from a terrible event 500 years ago in Brussels, Christians of different denominations are today united in singing together to confess their faith in Jesus Christ.—Therefore we want to gather with different churches and sing and pray together on **Saturday**, **1 July at 18:00 in a musical devotion in four languages in the "Eglise de Musée—Chapelle Royale", Rue du Musée 2 in Brussels. Please see the attached poster.**
